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Historical figures come and go. But only one came, and went, and still stays. That is the verified authenticity of the person of Jesus Christ. That is the audacious report of scripture. That is the overwhelming agreement of honest scholars and historians. Debate on the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ only comes from sources that choose to believe lies over reality.

Even non-Christian writings, not to distant from the life of Christ confirms the reality of the life of Christ. Roman names like Flavious Josephus, Tacitus, Pliny the Younger, and Suetonius all give historical verification of Christ's life. Tacitus for instance, in chronicling the burning of Rome in 64 A.D. mentions the blame being placed on the followers of "Christus" who was previously put to death by Pontious Pilate. These historians took seriously their task to research and present sound and solid accounts of history. I highlight this, because the same cannot be said for many of today's historians. These extra-biblical accounts shout, "Jesus of the bible is authentic and verified".

The death of Jesus was also among the historical writings of these Romans. Tacitus example above includes Jesus' execution. Flavious Josephus wrote in his work called **Antiquities**, "He was Christ; and when Pilate, at the suggestion of the principal men amongst us, had condemned him to the cross, those that loved him at the first did not forsake him, for he appeared to them alive again the third day, as the divine prophets had foretold these and ten thousand other wonderful things concerning him; and the tribe of Christians, so named from him, are not extinct at this day." Although some historians through the ages think that scribes may have smoothed over Josephus' account, it still authenticates a Christ that lived, died, and lived again.

But the main proof of all of this does not lie in the hands of men, but in the Hand of God. God ordained simple witnesses to walk with and to "write of a narrative of the things which have been fulfilled among us." (Luke 1:1) These witnesses gave up their lives standing firm in the accounts they reported. Their lives were changed while they lived, and their deaths were testimonies of the things they knew. A man will not die for a lie! And the Hand of God gave Christ into the world to live among man, to die for the sin of man, and to resurrect and ascend for salvation of man that the glory of God might be known. The continued proof of the Hand of God includes the changed lives of people throughout the ages. Men and women are still dying for the truth. Maybe not on a cross upside down, or in a fire on a stake (although that is happening), but to self and sin. And those changed lives wherein they do not live for themselves are proof that the Hand of God is still ordaining simple witnesses to walk with Christ and tell the wondrous story of the work of God.

Jesus came, and went, and still stays. Have you met Him? Have you had the Hand of God verify the authenticity of Christ in your life? God can prove more in one second of the reality of the Savior than all the historical Roman writings can through years. A changed life that dies to self and lives for God is evidence not created by natural things. It can only be created by the Hand of God. This Easter, make sure the celebration of the resurrected Christ is really your belief. Make certain there is no debate in your heart and mind concerning the death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus the Christ. How do you do that? Ask God to show you truth. He records not only the historical perspective correctly, but He writes the future exactly. Let God be the author of your story.



As James continues his letter to the believers scattered from persecution, we come to chapter 4 where he addresses the root of the problem they were having, quarreling. Evidently even during their difficulties of persecution as believers, they decided to turn on each other and fight amongst themselves! We easily can relate to that today, we seem to love to argue and quarrel amongst one another. The church today can spend more time and energy trying to make sure things are done the way we want them to be done!

James tells us from the Lord that the root is our passions! The war within our own lives between the new man we are as believers and the sin natl134ure that we still have to live with, is coming out in our dealings with those around us! It is such a bad situation that we will covet and even murder one another, not physically murder, but as Jesus stated in the sermon on the mount of Olives, when we hate someone we are guilty of murder! What a horrible testimony for any group of believers to have! James tells us again in 4:1,3 that the problem is our passions are wrong.

Now, how do we correct our passion desires? In verses 6-12 James writes that our submission to God is the key> We need to come before God in humility knowing that we don't know everything God is doing in the lives of others, realizing that we will have different desires then others around us, and that the devil is to be resisted when we see him using us for discord amongst the believers!

Oh what a testimony to the world we will be when we love one another to the point that we will fight for each other's desires more than our own desires! Is that not what Jesus left as an example to us in the garden before his crucifixion?

It was made at a moment of desperation and at a time while trying to keep up with the demands of ministry, family, and employer obligations. That choice reappeared only to put myself in a position that would possibly end my ministry and alter my relationship with co-workers, friends, and others. When I was approached about the issue I knew immediately I was in the wrong and wanted to do whatever it took to make amends. My heart was in the right place, my actions were not intentional, but there was no doubt I had crossed a line, and I would have to accept the consequences.

Just as King David responded when Nathan the Prophet confronted him of his sinful actions in 2nd Samuel 12 - I also fell to my knees seeking the Lord's forgiveness and mercy. It felt like a gut punch to my soul. Many thoughts and scenarios ran through my head about the possible repercussions or outcomes from my actions. I cried out like King David in Psalm 51, "Create in me a clean heart, O God! Renew a right spirit within me. Cast me not away from your presence or take Your Holy Spirit from me. Restore to me the joy of your salvation and grant me a willing spirit to sustain me."
