Are you led by the Holy Spirit?

"Well, yes, I have the Spirit of God in me since I trusted God for my salvation." That of course, is not the question asked. The question is, "are you led by the Spirit?". In other words, do you see and understand the prompting and directions the Spirit of God would have you go?

I revisited Romans 8:28 in sermon preparation time this week. "And we know that all things work together for good to those who love God, to those who are called according to His purpose." When reading this verse, it would be easy to take a laissez-faire attitude to life. "Que sera, sera!", meaning whatever will be, will be. As a Christian, it would be convenient to look at this verse and think that it is all in God's hands and we share no actionable agenda when it comes to God's work. And I think that would result in spiritual deformation for the believer.

Prior to verse 28, Romans 8:25 deals with us waiting for the hope of the redemption of our bodies with perseverance. Perseverance would be an active forward motion through life regardless of circumstances with eyes fixed on God. That means our active participation! "But I am not equipped." Doubt, fear, distraction, all encumber us to always walk strongly. Thankfully, we have other actions on the agenda if we are to grow more Godly found in verse 26 of Romans 8. Verse 26 supplies the understanding that our desires are tuned to God and growth through the mess of this world as we "pray". We take the action to pray, even though ill-sufficient in this endeavor. Yet we pray. And what happens? The Holy Spirit meets us in prayer and teaches us our real needs. "... the Spirit Himself makes intercession FOR us with groanings which cannot be uttered." Who needs informed of reality and truth, God the Father, or me, myself, and I? It seems that the information needed is for the one praying and the Spirit of God is ready to meet us in prayer to strengthen our walk.

Again, verse 27 shows it is our heart and mind that "HE" searches. Who is the "HE"? God the Father is looking into your heart as you pray, then makes intercession through the Spirit **FOR** you, the saint according to the will of God the Father. Your active participation in prayer joins in with a heavenly work of God intended to form you and shape you towards Godliness, no matter what in the world is going on around you.

Now, through the hope that looks towards the redemption and the God informed prayers that trains our hearts and minds from the throne of God through the presence of the Holy Spirit, God is now free to participate in "working all things together for good" in your life. Remember, it is "to those who love God" – eyes fixed on God with perseverance. It is "to those who are called according to His purpose" – Your prayers informed by the Spirit from the Father!

And what is the "good" that God is working all things, including your willful, active pursuit towards? Romans 8:29 is the "good" in question! It's not about easy lives, or bigger bank accounts, or lack of problems. The "good" that God the Father through the intercession FOR you by the Holy Spirit in accordance with your perseverance and prayers is all to "conform you to the image of His Son". God will send you through hell on earth all the while holding your hand and speaking to you through the Spirit if hell on earth is what it takes to make you Christ-like!

Romans 8:28 is not a promise of ease or a cause to just glide through life. It is an invitation to join God in His work for you. To be actively listening to the council of the Father through the utterances of the Holy Spirit so that you don't lose hope when going through the fire. It is a promise, that as you actively engage with God through everything, He will use it all to make you resemble Christ so that when the hope of redemption is fully realized, you enter the kingdom as the very brother of Christ, both by blood and character.

But don't miss the point. You will not grow closer to a family resemblance of Christ without love for God and listening to the purposes of God. You are to be an active participant in God's work for you. Keep your sight set on the redemption of our bodies - heaven, and keep your hearts present before God - prayer. [Philippians 4:6-7] Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God; 7 and the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus. Only God can give you peace during conflict and at the same time shape you like Christ. That is the "good" that God would have all things in your life working towards!

On the average of once or twice a week someone says to me, "I know I need to be in the choir." They usually follow with a statement of desire to be involved in part of some ministry of the church. Sometimes I hear "I feel so disconnected from God." Yes, there are times I feel distant from the Lord then realize this feeling is because of a lack of much needed quiet time with Him. There are also those who choose to use the Lord's day as needing a break from the busy week of daily life and other commitments. It appears to be our human nature to avoid God's presence.

The Israelites had a day that they would never forget. When the Ark of the Covenant was brought into King Solomon's newly built temple, "...the priests could not perform the service because of the cloud, for the glory of the Lord filled His temple" (1 Kings 8:11). They were so overwhelmed with God's presence that it caused them to retreat! We experience the glory of God when we live His way and walk by faith. Before we rush into His church and ask Him to bless us, we may need to ask ourselves some tough questions: "Am I involved with something God wouldn't approve of?" "Am I not fulfilling a commitment that I have made?" "Is God pleased with the way I am acting?"

There is no automatic pilot with obedience. It takes a constant dialogue between you and the Lord Jesus to know His desires for your life. Then, as you live according to God's will, you'll experience life's greatest reward; a clean heart, the joy of His salvation, and the glory of His presence. (Psalm 51)

"Therefore I urge you, brethren, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living and holy sacrifice, acceptable to God, which is your spiritual service of worship. And do not be conformed to. this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, so that you may prove what the will of God is, that which is good and acceptable and perfect." (Romans 12:1-2)
