Matthew 16:18 is one of the most comforting verses in scripture as it pertains to the continuity and permanence of the New Testament church. On the heals of a spiritually given confession by Peter about the deity of Jesus Christ, Jesus pronounces Peter a rock. Remember, Jesus had just asked, "whom do men say that I, the Son of Man, am?" To this question, the disciples supplied the opinions of men that they had heard lobbied about in meeting places and in homes they had visited. People are never short on opinions. It's been said where 2 or 3 Baptist are gathered, there will be 10 opinions. Check out social media. Listen to the entertainment industry. Watch the different news outlets. Listen to our politicians. Various opinions grasp to define reality. And everyone is right – in their own eyes.

Jesus then turned the question straight to the disciples. "But whom do you say I am?" (Mt. 16:15). Here is the test. Jesus is not looking for opinion. He is testing the truth the disciples would hold in their heart. He is ascertaining whether these disciples are believing winds of words or shifting sands of opinions or have they gained the unmovable truth of God.

Peter supplies a solid answer. He does not give some flippant opinion. What he says is eternal truth encased in syllables of pronunciations that form words. But those words are not man's words, they are God's words revealed to man and repeated by man. Jesus pronounces Peter "blessed". To be blessed is to receive something from the blesser. And Jesus states Peter was indeed a recipient. "Flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but my Father who is in heaven" (Mt. 16:17). In other words, what Peter received and repeated was not the product of man's imagination. It was not simply an opinion. It was a revealed truth of God.

And that is, in my estimation, the object of Jesus' next statement. We get to the "rock" statement of Jesus. He called Peter a rock by using his full Greek name, Petras. And then Jesus said, "on THIS rock, I will build my church." Was Jesus saying He would build His church upon the Apostle Peter? A cursory reading of Peter's actions, both in the gospels and in Acts, would paint a picture of an uncertain, insecure, impetuous type of person at times. Surely Peter is not the foundation of the church. 1 Corinthians 3:11 says "For no other foundation can anyone lay than that which is laid, which is Jesus Christ." If Jesus is the foundation, when He addressed Peter, was Jesus talking about Himself? In a way, yes. But more directly, Jesus was talking about the truth Peter had just spoken. The words, that are spiritually given and spiritually discerned, "You are the Christ, the Son of the Living God", is the solid rock. It is the truth of God that is not shifting nor sinking sand. It is the truth of God that is solid, which stands as the foundation for the church which Christ will build.

This is why this verse is the most comforting verse in scripture regarding the permanence of the church. God's truth is the stable and secure foundation that His church is still being built upon. And Christ is still in the building business. As Christians are spiritually led into, and given the truth of God, Jesus builds His church through such. The comfort? He can use messed up people like Peter. He can use us despite our faults.

We've got decisions to make. Our families? Our church? Our association? Ahh. Maybe that's the first step in "our" decisions. If it's Christ's church which Christ is building, perhaps the solid, rock-like answer we need to give is one we find from God. And the comfort I have in the direction we go in decisions; Christ will do what He needs to build. I want to be of those that seek the truth of God in the questions before us. I don't want opinions to rule the day. I want God given answers and directions. That never happens in the physical realm alone. That only comes by receiving from the Father. And that comes by listening. And listening comes by spending time with God. Then, and only then, can we give "rock" solid answers.

A Time For Every Purpose Under Heaven

A time to be born, a time to die A time to plant, a time to reap A time to kill, a time to heal A time to laugh, a time to weep

These lyrics are taken from the book of Ecclesiastes, as found in the KJV of the Bible (Ecc. 3:1-8) though the sequence of the words were rearranged for this song. Ecclesiastes is traditionally ascribed to King Solomon and the Biblical text views there being a time and place for all things. We follow and prepare for all kinds of seasons in our lives. There is the spring, summer, fall and winter season. We have different kinds of sports seasons (Baseball, Football, Softball, etc.). As believers we have the seasons of Christmas, Easter and outreach. As a Minister of Music I deal with the worship Season. Yes, in my years of experience I have come to recognize this season that comes year after year in leading the music ministry. Like any ministry it has its season of highs and lows, with mountain top experiences and valleys of meandering. The seasons of worship used to cause me great stress and anxiety (Phil. 4:7-8), but not anymore.

King Solomon starts the Book of Ecclesiastes in chapter 1 with these words: "Meaningless! Meaningless!" says the Teacher. "Utterly meaningless! Everything is meaningless." What do people gain from all their labors at which they toil under the sun?" As a servant of Christ I completely understood his frustration. When it came to choir ministry I used to let things like attendance, participation, and commitment bother me. Will they approve of this anthem, or that musical, or this hymn or that chorus? Will they approve of this style of music or the direction of the worship service? I could go on but I believe you understand.

After much prayer, the Lord revealed to me that it's not about approval, it's all about Him. He helped me realize that I cannot control or judge members of the choir (or the church) about their level of commitment or participation. That is between them and the Lord. He showed me to be grateful for all who participate (whether it is 5 or 25), to be attentive more to worship and not entertainment, and to rejoice whether on the mountain top or walking through the valley. My role as Minister (of Music) is to exalt the Savior, equip the saints, evangelize the sinner, and encourage, support, and be prepared for all seasons.

King Solomon continued in chapter 3:1 saying: "There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under the heavens." And in verse 11 he states: "He has made everything beautiful in its time. He has also set eternity in the human heart; yet no one can fathom what God has done from beginning to end." I believe this to be true with our seasons of worship. Many people believe they cannot sing well enough to be in the choir but I often remind them that throughout the Psalms (KJV) we are called to "Make a joyful noise..." It's not about perfection. It's about worshiping in spirit and in truth! (John 4:23) All are welcome to join our church worship ministry and together we can work on the timing and tuning. I am grateful to all who are involved and God is at work from beginning to end for His time, and for every purpose under heaven.
